

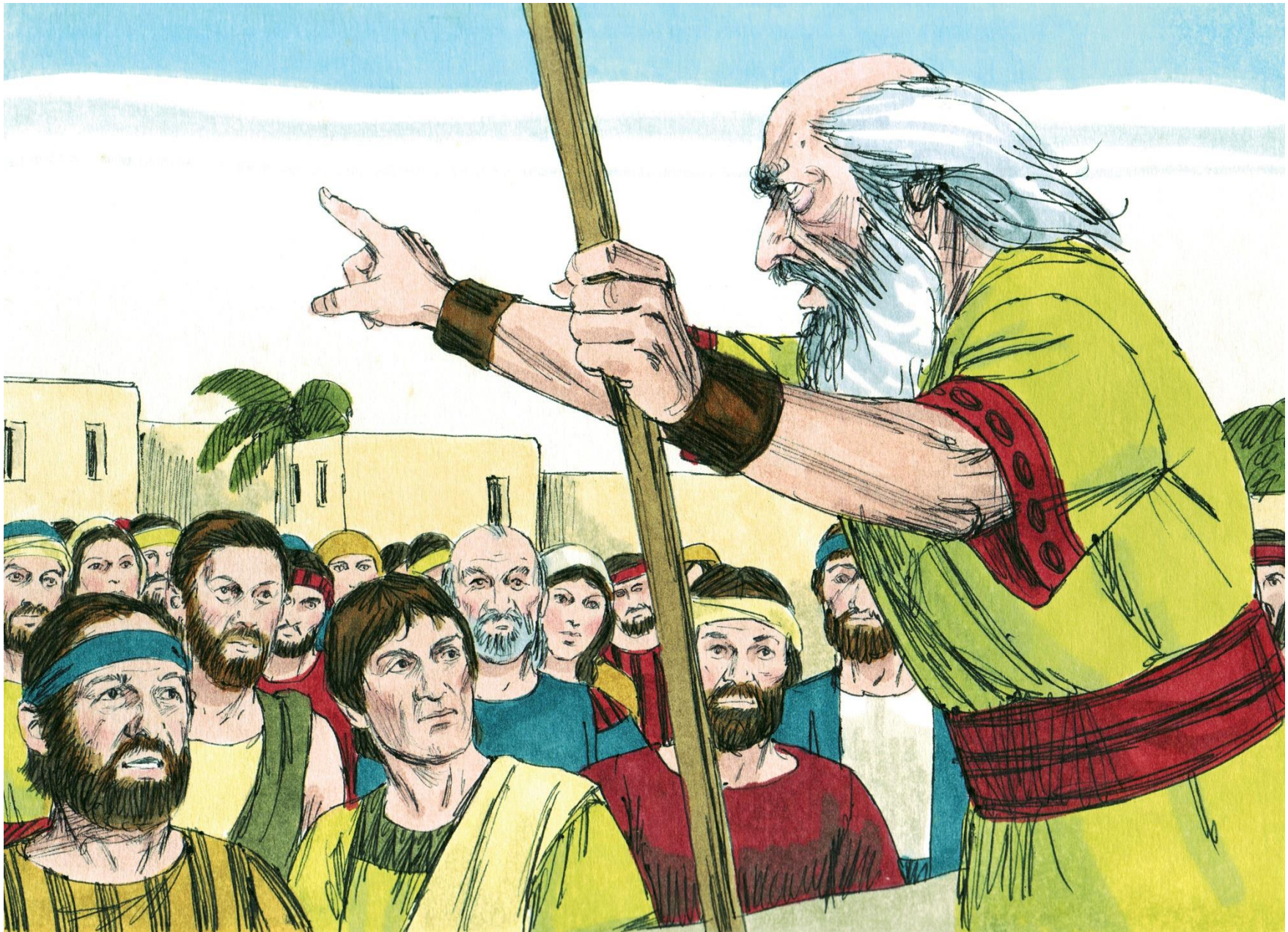


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Lesson 2--1

Since Saul rejected God's Word, God rejected him as king and would tear the kingdom away from Saul.



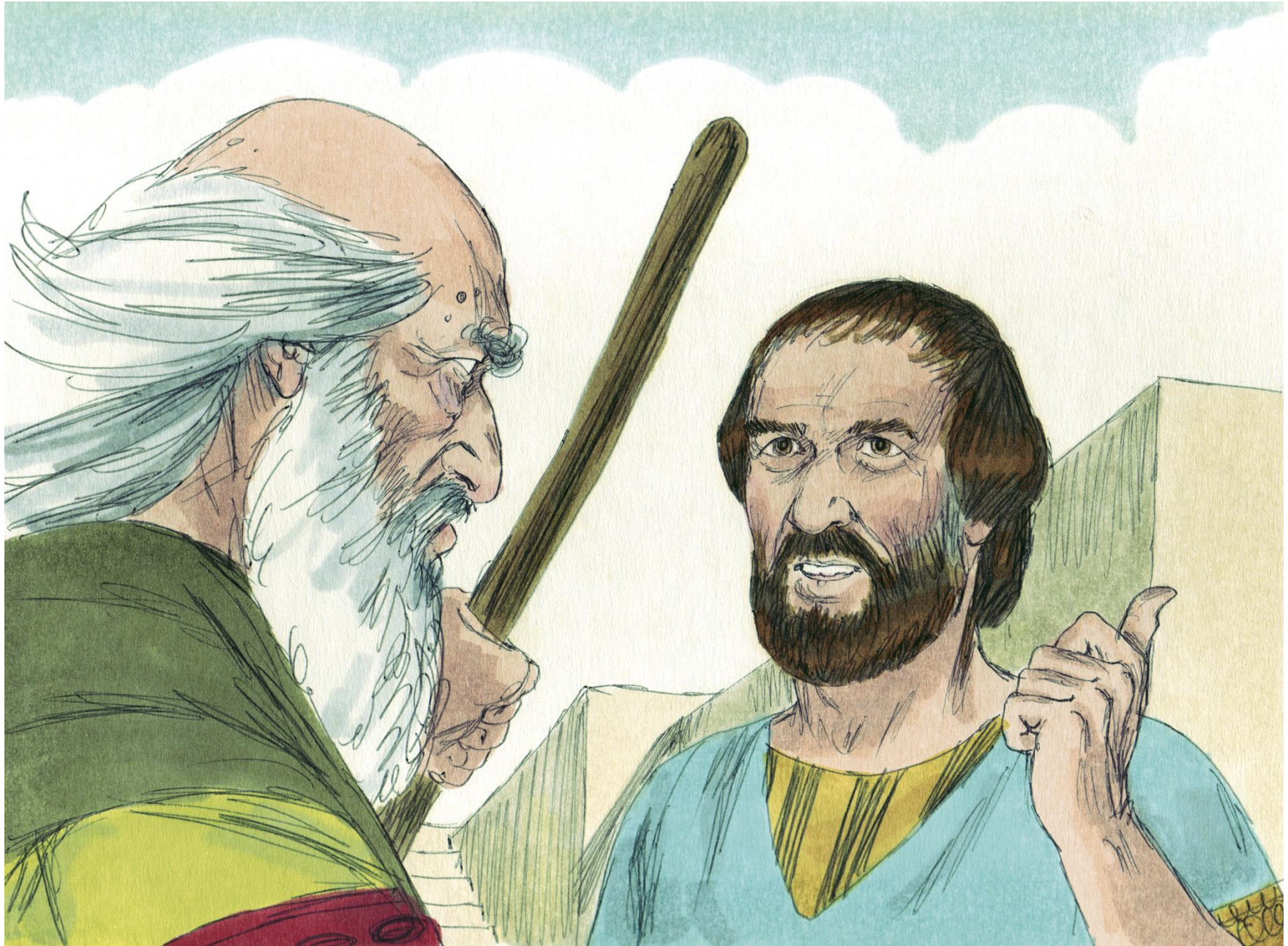
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Lesson 2--8 God told Samuel to fill his horn with oil and go to Bethlehem to Jesse, for one of his sons would be the new king.
